Good progress has been made with the multi-user access to the hall and this work remains on track to be finished by the end of 2023. Outdoor Spaces

- Love the Leaves: This is the ideal time to gather leaves as the trees shed for the winter. Compass volunteers and staff have been busy raking leaves and gathering them for the specific leaf composting bins. When kept separate from the main garden waste / compost bins, composted leaves, known as leaf mold, provide an excellent mulch next season.
- Honey Harvests: Outdoor Areas Manager, Olivier Billaud, gained experience in the processing of honey this month. Using harvests from the Compass bee hives as well as neighbouring Camphill sites, he was able to learn how to extract the honey using the facilities available on Camphill Estate, pictured above. We hope to offer Compass honey through our Produce Pop-Ups shortly.
- Garden Preparations: Volunteers have helped to terrace the bank of the polytunnel over the last few weeks in preparation for herb planting next year. A great job done, thanks team!
- Produce Pop-Ups: every Thur 2pm 4pm, Fri 10am 1pm & 1st Saturday / month, 10am 4pm Enjoy a range of seasonal produce including Compass honey and Compass Firewood. Stock up on firewood during the colder months; bags are available for sale at just £10.50 or you can bulk buy a cubic metre for £105. We also have kindling and wood chippings for sale.
